MOTIONS (Notice given on 20 March 2023):

1. Draft resolution (Mr K J Mileham): That the House -
 - (1) notes that on 6 March 2023, as part of his Cabinet reshuffle, the President of the Republic, Mr M C Ramaphosa announced the appointment of Dr K D Ramokgopa as the new Minister of Electricity to oversee the Republic's overall response to the electricity crisis and to reduce the frequency of loadshedding;
 - (2) further notes that section 55(2) of the Constitution provides for mechanisms to ensure that all organs of State in the national sphere of government are accountable to the National Assembly and that the Assembly maintains oversight of national executive authority;

- (3) recalls that as the Assembly has to date not established a committee or oversight body to maintain oversight over The Presidency, under which the new Ministry of Electricity falls, it is impossible for the Assembly to exercise its constitutionally mandated oversight responsibilities over Minister Ramokgopa and the Office he heads;
- (4) acknowledges that the Republic's electricity crisis is an urgent national emergency which requires active Parliamentary involvement and oversight over Executive interventions to address it, and that Minister Ramokgopa is therefore duty bound to account to the Assembly and the people of South Africa on the work being done to address the electricity crisis;
- (5) recognises that as the work of Minister Ramokgopa and his Office traverses both the Energy and Public Enterprises portfolios, there is a need for a combined, ad hoc committee to be established to exercise oversight;
- (6) resolves to establish an ad hoc committee in terms of Rule 253(1)(a), the committee to –
 - (a) exercise oversight over the new Minister of Electricity and the implementation of the Office of the Minister's programme of action;
 - (b) monitor and oversee the work and budgets of the new Ministry and hold it accountable on project deliverables;
 - (c) exercise any of the powers as set out in Rule 167 that may assist it in carrying out its task;
 - (d) consist of 11 voting members of the Assembly, as follows: African National Congress 6, Democratic Alliance 2, Economic Freedom Fighters 1 and other parties 2; and
 - (e) further consists of 14 non-voting members of the Assembly, as follows: African National Congress 2, Democratic Alliance 1, Economic Freedom Fighters 1 and other parties 10; and
