 - (2) further notes that this past week the municipality has neither assisted the residents of this extension with alternate water supply nor forwarded any communication to this community about the lack of water supply;

- (3) realises that the water cannon that needs to deliver water, in the event of any water supply being interrupted, is broken and that the municipality awaits a quotation on the cost to have it repaired;
- (4) further realises that section 27 (1) (b) of the Constitution stipulates that everyone has a right to have access to sufficient food and water, and that this right obligates the municipality to make water available and accessible to the public;
- (5) condemns the alleged lack of interest of the officials of Thaba Chweu to address this water crisis;
- (6) further condemns all actions of neglect and ignorance relating to the non-supply of water;
- (7) calls upon the Minister of Co-operative Governance and Traditional Affairs (COGTA) and the MEC of COGTA to urgently intervene as this municipality is one of the worst performing municipalities in Mpumalanga and the country;
- (8) further realises that the Democratic Alliance (DA) in Thaba Chweu will be laying a complaint with the Human Rights Commission in Nelspruit in this regard; and
- (9) recognises that under a DA-run government, every citizen will be provided with basic services.

18. Draft resolution (Mr M Bagraim): That the House -

- (1) notes that the national minimum wage was introduced on 1 January 2019 much to the dismay of many welfare organisations;
- (2) further notes that the organisations have made representations to the Departments of Labour and Social Development, advising that their staff in the protected workshops are in fact defined as workers as contained in the definition of the National Minimum Wage Act;
- (3) understands that the workers within these workshops are now entitled to receive a salary of at least R20 per hour for at least four hours per day;
- (4) further understands that currently these workers do not receive that payment and are therefore considered to be engaging in an illegal work situation;
- (5) recognises that many of these workshops are government sponsored at a much lesser amount than the R20 per hour;
- (6) acknowledges that the unintended consequence of the minimum wage legislation is now threatening to force NGO's to stop providing occupational therapy to many of their disabled workers, with two of the protected workshops already having to close;

- (7) admits that the stipend provided through the Department of Health as a subsidy is not adequate to cover the national minimum wage, and that many employers are unable to provide additional finances over and above the national minimum wage; and
- (8) further acknowledges that government is directly responsible for the closure of many of these workshops, leaving the most vulnerable within our communities, especially persons with disabilities, displaced and without assistance.

- (4) recognises that the crisis has now spread to other areas including Kwa Thema, Springs, Makause, Boksburg, Thokoza, Actonville, Jerusalem, Benoni, Delmore, Angelo, Germiston and Alberton;
- (5) understands that despite petitions handed to the Metro municipality and motions tabled in Council, there has been no response from the Mayor, relevant MMC or the Head of Department (HoD);

- (6) further understands that the HoD was reported to have informed the Metro's Petitions Committee that the situation was back to normal and refuse removal services were up to date;
- (7) calls upon the Mayor to urgently resolve this crisis as it seems this is what the ANC believes to be normal services; and
- (8) condemns this blatant disregard for the dignity and rights of Ekurhuleni residents.

18. Draft resolution (Mrs H O Mkhalihi): That the House -

- (1) notes that the Commander-in-Chief and President of the Economic Freedom Fighters (EFF) Julius Malema celebrated his 38th birthday, this past Sunday;
- (2) further notes that he celebrated his birthday by spending the day with children at Entokozweni Day Care Centre in Orange Farm;
- (3) acknowledges the contribution he has made in the struggle for economic liberation and for the restoration of the dignity of the African child;
- (4) appreciates his sacrifice, selflessness, and willingness to lead by example;
- (5) understands that the struggle for Economic Freedom is safe under his leadership; and
- (6) wishes him well as he enters his 39th year, the year in which he will become President of South Africa.

- (4) acknowledges that many elderly women who become forgetful or senile are often identified as witches by some and are subject to persecution, violence and even death;
- (5) calls on government to recognise individual land rights for women and give them title deeds so that they can live in safety and security, tilling the soil and making a living for themselves and their children;

- (6) further calls on government to launch a national campaign to increase the awareness of senility and vulnerability of elderly women, to encourage respect for the elderly (also known as 'Gogo's'), and to provide practical assistance to them by increasing the number of social workers, caregivers and clinics in rural areas;
- (7) understands that this call is motivated by the need to curb violence and discrimination against women of all ages and to foster a human rights culture in South Africa throughout the year;
- (8) pays tribute to the work of Dr Nomfundo Mali in establishing the Women's Empowerment Project and the Widow's Sanctuary, and appeal for recognition and assistance for this worthy cause; and
- (9) recognises that this would be a fitting way to mark International Women's Day which is celebrated on 8 March.
