In respect of **Orders 1 to 7 and 9**, the Speaker administered reprimands in the following terms:

Order! Thank you very much, Hon Deputy Speaker and to Hon members on the platform. I will request that all Hon members, whose names have been read out in respect of the reports that come from the Joint Committee on Ethics and Members Interests as well as the Powers and Privileges Committee, show their face on the platform.

As you know, I am not going to deal with each report and the content in it because it is already available to all of you.

I just want to say to you, but also to all Hon members, that if you look at the offences that have been committed by respective members, it really goes against the Code of Ethics that we have accepted and which we as Hon members would abide by.

I do want to appreciate that most of you have shown remorse in terms of the actions that were intended. However, it also says to each one of us that we do need to remember that our Code of Ethics does not only relate to what we

do in the House, but it could also be what we write on social media, or what we say to other members of the public.

I hope that your engagements with the Committee on Powers and Privileges, as well as the Joint Committee on Ethics and Members Interests has shown where you have done wrong, that you have appreciated that this will not happen again. However, this is also a reminder to all of us as members that we should always remember the oath of office that we have taken.

There are various sanctions that have been given, which have been communicated to members, where they would have to comply.

Some of you will be suspended for 15 plenary sessions and others for 20 plenary sessions. However, some of you will have to pay a fine — R10,000 and another R15,000. I would also like the three members who are here, who have been asked by the Ethics Committee to apologise to the House for their conduct to do so.

The Speaker then instructed the following members to enter an apology to the House, as recommended in the respective reports agreed to by the House: Hon F Adams, Hon N P Nkabane and Hon M V Daniels .

The Speaker informed the House that in terms of the sanctions imposed on Mr D MacPherson that the member would be required to enter an apology when he was next in the House.
