- (2) (a) what shortcomings have been identified on enforcement in each region and (b) what plans are in place to address such challenges? CW1094E

*Abalone received/confiscated***970. Ms T Breedt (Free State: FF Plus) to ask the Minister of Forestry, Fisheries and the Environment:**

- (1) What is the live equivalent mass of all abalone that has been (a) received and/or (b) confiscated by his department in the past five years;

Technologies for visually impaired persons

- (a) What is the total number of persons who are living with visual impairments in the country, (b) what interventions has she made to ensure that visually impaired persons have access to assistive technologies such as braille in all public spaces throughout all provinces, (c) to what extent is such technologies available and (d) what are the details of interventions and breakdown in each (i) province and (ii) municipality in this regard? Steps against mining corporations/energy companies

976. Mr K Ceza (Mpumalanga: EFF) to ask the Minister of Forestry, Fisheries and the Environment:

In light of the well-documented and escalating environmental destruction in Mpumalanga that is caused by unchecked local mining, acid mine drainage, deforestation, toxic emission from

coal-fired power stations and the continued failure to rehabilitate mined land, particularly in areas such as Emalahleni, Kriel, Carolina and Hendrina, (a) what urgent interventions have been made against mining corporations and energy companies that are responsible for polluting water systems, destroying agricultural land and poisoning air in historically black and working class communities, (b) why has his department failed to implement a comprehensive community-driven environmental monitoring and enforcement system, despite years of reports that are highlighting premature deaths, chronic respiratory illnesses and ecological collapse, (c) what budgetary allocations have been geared specifically for environmental restoration in Mpumalanga and (d) who are identified beneficiaries of such programmes in this regard? SA Digital Transformation

In light of the execution of South Africa's Digital Transformation, (a) what specific programmes he has put in place to address digital skills gap among the workforce, including upskilling and reskilling initiatives, (b) what are the key challenges and risks that are associated with the implementation of the roadmap, (c) how are they being mitigated and (d) how will he ensure that digital transformation (i) benefits all citizens and (ii) will not exacerbate existing inequalities?
