- (1) In light of the recent increase in stone-throwing incidents that have severely impacted Blue Trains in Cape Town (details furnished), what (a) total number of the specified trains have been damaged due to stone-throwing incidents and (b)(i) are the specific dates that each train was taken out of service, (ii) is the (aa) duration of its repair and (bb) timeline for restoration to full service;
- (2) whether there are concrete plans to increase security presence by deploying additional personnel and/or through collaboration with local law enforcement agencies to deter future incidents; if not, what is the position in this regard; if so, what specific measures are being implemented to protect the high-value, multimillion-rand assets, especially along identified hotspots on vulnerable rail lines;
- (3) given that stone-throwing has historically been a recurring issue, what are the reasons that the Passenger Rail Agency of South Africa was not more proactive in safeguarding the trains, considering the substantial investment and importance of the rail service;
- (4) whether she will furnish Ms M P Kobe with detailed information on the financial impact of the repair efforts, including the costs associated with ongoing repairs and maintenance due to stone-throwing incidents; if not, why not; if so, what are the relevant details;
