 - (6) realises that people are on their own, and those that are responsible for protecting them and maintain law and order fail to do so; and
 - (7) sends its condolences to the bereaved families and wishes Noziphiwo Ziya a speedy recovery.

- (b) majority of learners never complete their studies, but drop out of school and roam the streets committing crime;
- (3) acknowledges that this matter was reported many times by the school together with members of the community to the police and the Department of Social Development, yet nothing has been done;
- (4) realises that gangsterism and violence are taking place inside schools in Mhluzi township, a place where learners were supposed to feel safe, learn and prepare for their future as productive members of society and improve their living conditions;
- (5) further realises that the youth that we fail to protect today, are the ones we will need protection from tomorrow as society; and
- (6) calls on the people of Ward 28 in the Steve Tshwete Local Municipality to come together, organise and fight the problem of drug abuse and gangsterism, and thereby protect the future of our children.
