1. Draft resolution (Ms T J Mokwele): That the Council-
 - (1) notes the violent and criminal abuse of Bongekile "Babes Wodumo" Simelane, by Mandla "Mampintsha" Maphumulo;
 - (2) condemns the repulsive and disgusting actions of Mampintsha who we know has previously abused Babes despite his denials;
 - (3) acknowledges that everyday women across South Africa are killed, including by their husband's partners and family members, and that this is beyond a crisis;
 - (4) further notes that Mampintsha was released on bail of R2000 when students during Fees Must Fall did not even get bail or had to pay R3000;
 - (5) recognises that men must rid themselves of all women abusers and patriarchs;
 - (6) sends a message of support to Babes;

- (7) calls on the justice system to make an example of Mampintsha; and
- (8) calls on all media outlets across the country to boycott and silence Mampintsha. 19dc 04

2. Draft resolution (Mr Khumalo): That the Council-

- (1) notes and welcomes with appreciation the establishment of the SIU special tribunal by His Excellency, President Cyril Ramaphosa last week;
- (2) further notes that Judge Gidfonia Mlindelwa Makhanya has been appointed as the Chairperson of the Tribunal, for a three-year term including his team of 7 judges;
- (3) further notes that this special tribunal is aimed at fast-tracking the finalization of more than R7 billion in civil claims linked to corrupt or irregular state contracts, and ensuring that looted taxpayer's money is returned back to the state to serve the interests of our people;
- (4) acknowledges that this initiative is one of the many that demonstrates the commitment and seriousness of the ANC government under the stewardship of President Cyril Ramaphosa to wage a concerted and resolute battle against corruption and ensuring that those who manipulated State and governance processes to benefit their heavy pockets and those of their friends and families are held accountable; and
- (5) commends President Ramaphosa on his unwavering stance against all forms of corruption. 19dc 05

3. Draft resolution (Mr J WW Julius): That the Council-

- (1) congratulates the Western Cape government on reaching their target of full broadband coverage, with a total of 1875 sites;
- (2) notes that these sites include over 1200 schools, 200 libraries and exactly 400 other public facilities;
- (3) further notes the Western Cape government is converting 1600 of the province's broadband points into free WI-FI sites, with 3 gigabytes of free data to the public each month with a top-up rate of R15 for 2 gigabytes. This is 40% lower than the nearest mobile competitor; and

- (4) finally notes that the public can also access free internet in 70 Cape Access Centres, most of them located in the province's most rural towns and villages. 19dc 07

4. Draft resolution (Ms C Labuschagne): That the Council-

- (1) congratulates the DA Western Alliance Cape government for growing employment in the province by 24.8% between 2009 and 2018;
- (2) notes that the Western Cape has South Africa's lowest unemployment rate at 14%;
- (3) also notes that a total of 508 000 jobs were created in the Western Cape since the DA took office; and
- (4) further notes that R1 Billion in economic savings have been generated through red tape reduction and Ease of Doing Business strategies. 19dc 9

5. Draft resolution (Mr C Hattingh): That the Council-

- (1) debates the memorandum sent out by SA School Athletics (SASA) to all its provincial offices that all SASA teams on all levels of competition must expedite a quota of a minimum of 40% from previously disadvantaged communities, with emphasis on females;
- (2) notes that the quota also includes one athlete per event and age group must be from a previously disadvantaged community which can be the fourth athlete in the event, while there is no qualifying standard needed for this athlete;
- (3) also notes that in a 1971 statement, the ANC stated that "sportsmen have a special duty in this regard in that they should be first to insist that merit, and merit alone, be the criterion for selecting teams for representative sport; and
- (4) lastly notes that the ANC has failed to truly transform sport representation through merit-based initiatives that fairly include previously disadvantaged peoples. 19dc 10

6. Draft resolution (Mr W F Faber): That the Council –

- (1) congratulates the Western Cape on increasing the matric pass rate from 75.7% in 2009 to 81.5% in 2018;
- (2) further notes that the Maths pass rate increase from 64.7% in 2009, to 76% in 2018, while the Science pass rate increased from 52.05 in 2009, to 79.5% in 2018, and

- (3) lastly notes that the Retention Rate from Grades 10-12 in the province is the highest in the country, at around 63% for the 2018 Matric results. No other province got above 50% in their retention rate. 19dc 11

7. Draft resolution (Mr E Makue): That the Council-

- (1) notes with concern the increasing media reports about the allegations of maladministration and corruption in the Tshwane Metropolitan council under the leadership of the DA and its alliance partners;
- (2) further notes that this ranges from nepotism in the appointment of senior staff without proper qualifications to the escalating corruption that threatens good governance and service delivery;
- (3) also notes that virtual collapse of the state governance due to infighting between the City manager and the DA Mayors; and
- (4) condemns in the strongest terms the hypocrisy of the DA as champions of good governance. 19dc 12

8. Draft resolution (Ms T K Mampuru): That the Council-

- (1) notes with concern that South African Human Rights Commissioners reacted with shock at the conditions under which the pupils at Tsitsa and Nalikamva Primary Schools in Mfuleni were taught;
- (2) further notes that yesterday the commissioners witnessed first-hand how teachers dealt with more than 100 pupils each day when they made a surprise visit to the schools after receiving complaints from the parents;
- (3) also notes that the parents demanded quality education for their children who had been placed in a platoon system because some children have not been taught since the start of the academic year; and
- (4) calls on the DA run Western Cape Department of Education to take serious the education of black children in the Western Cape and stop thinking about back people only during election time. 19dc 06

9. Draft resolution (Mr G Michalakis): That the Council-

- (1) congratulates the DA Western Cape government for creating 4300 internship opportunities for young South

Africans through the Premier's Advancement of Youth Internship programme;

- (2) further notes that since 2014, the Western Cape government has also provided 6575 health bursaries to medical students across different disciplines such as nursing pharmacy, physio and dentistry;
- (3) also notes that the Western Cape government has spent R53.7 million over 5 years on youth opportunities initiatives in the agricultural sector; and
- (4) finally notes that the DA is the only party capable of running a government that cares for and provides opportunities for the youth of South Africa. 19dc 08
