3500. Ms S Gcilishe (EFF) to ask the Minister of Justice and Constitutional Development:

The acquittal of Pastor Timothy Omotoso, despite serious allegations and years of trial, has raised public concerns about the efficacy of prosecuting gender-based violence (GBV) and high-profile crimes, (a) what specific reforms will her department implement to strengthen (i) evidence gathering, (ii) witness protection and (iii) prosecutorial strategy to avoid similar outcomes in future, (b) what support is offered to the survivors in the specified case and (c) how will her department ensure that victims of GBV are not deterred from coming forward due to high-profile acquittals?

3501. Mr G C Niehaus (EFF) to ask the Minister in The Presidency:

- (1) Whether, in view of the policy direction issued by the Minister of Communications and Digital Technologies published in the *Government Gazette* on 23 May 2025, which allows for Equity Equivalent Investment Programmes (EEIPs) as an alternative to the 30% Broad-Based Black Economic Empowerment (B-BBEE) equity ownership requirement, potentially enabling foreign multinationals such as a certain company owned by a certain person (details furnished) to operate in the Republic without direct ownership transformation obligations, she consider that the policy direction constitutes a national security risk; if not, what is the position in this regard; if so, what are the relevant details;
- (2) whether she is concerned that the Republic's critical telecommunications capabilities may be handed over to a foreign company led by an individual who has publicly expressed hostility toward the Republic's B-BBEE legislation and broader transformation agenda; if not, what is the position in this regard; if so, what are the relevant details;

- (3) whether, given that the specified person's public dissemination of misinformation about a so-called white genocide in the Republic and his repeated antagonism toward the Republic's constitutional principles, she has found that granting the specified person's company access to national information and communications technology infrastructure through this policy is a threat to the sovereignty, cybersecurity and/or national stability of the Republic; if not, what is the position in this regard; if so, what (a) specific national security risk assessments have been undertaken by the State Security Agency in relation to the entry of Starlink and similar foreign multinationals into the Republic's telecommunications space under the proposed EEIP regime and (b) measures are in place to ensure that the Republic's strategic telecommunications infrastructure is protected from potential exploitation or undue foreign influence, especially by entities whose leadership has demonstrated open opposition to the Republic's policies of redress and constitutional transformation?
