MINISTERIAL STATEMENT:

1. Statement by the Minister of Employment and Labour on disbursement of Unemployment Insurance Fund.

MOTIONS:

1. Draft resolution (Chief Whip of the Majority Party): That the House –
 - (1) notes with sadness the sudden passing on of African National Congress (ANC) Member of Parliament (MP), Ms Dora Dunana Dlamini, at the age of 57, on Wednesday, 10 June 2020;
 - (2) recognises that Ms Dlamini was one of the 231 representatives of the ruling party sworn-in as a member of the Sixth Parliament following the 2019 elections;
 - (3) recalls that she previously served as a member of the KwaZulu-Natal provincial legislature for five years before she was deployed to the National Assembly;
 - (4) further recalls that in the National Assembly she served as a member of the Portfolio Committee on Public Enterprises;
 - (5) acknowledges that she worked diligently from her constituency in KwaZulu-Natal and visited schools as part of her last constituency work on Monday, 8 June 2020, to assess the readiness of schools to reopen, a clear indication of her honourable service to the people;
 - (6) further acknowledges her last act of duty which saw her attending a National Assembly plenary session on 9 June 2020 via the Zoom platform;

- (7) remembers Ms Dunana as a dedicated public representative who served until her last moments; and
- (8) extends its heartfelt condolences to the Dlamini family, friends and colleagues.

2. Draft resolution (Chief Whip of the Opposition): That the House –

- (1) notes that Mrs Thandi Gloria Mpambo-Sibhukwana - an educator, legislator and gallant fighter for the poor, women and the youth trapped in substance abuse - sadly passed away in Cape Town aged 55, on 19 June 2020;
- (2) acknowledges that Mrs Mpambo-Sibhukwana served as a Member of Parliament for the Democratic Alliance, first serving as a Permanent Delegate of the Western Cape in the National Council of Provinces during the Fifth Parliament, and in the National Assembly since the start of the Sixth Parliament;
- (3) recognises that, after teaching isiXhosa at Wynberg High School for many years, Mrs Mpambo-Sibhukwana served the people of the Western Cape as a senior official in the Office of the Premier, before becoming a Member of Parliament in 2014;
- (4) recalls that Mrs Mpambo-Sibhukwana continued to dedicate her life and career to preserving her home language, isiXhosa, after entering the Public Service;
- (5) further recalls that although Mrs Mpambo-Sibhukwana was concerned about the social ills in the country, she remained hopeful that things would change as long as those in positions of authority had the courage to affect the change, becoming a proud activist and advocate for the poor and vulnerable while serving in the public service;
- (6) further notes that Mrs Mpambo-Sibhukwana is survived by her husband and two daughters; and
- (7) conveys its heartfelt condolences to the Mpambo and Sibhukwana families, her colleagues in the Democratic Alliance and Parliament, and friends.

3. Draft resolution (Chief Whip of the Majority Party): That the House –

- (1) notes with great sadness the passing of African National Congress (ANC) Member of Parliament, Mr Zamuxolo Joseph Peter who had succumbed to Covid-19 on Friday, 31 July 2020;
- (2) recognises that Mr Peter, who was born on 10 January 1965 in a small rural town village called Riebeeck East in Makhanda, was a longstanding ANC leader in the Eastern Cape Province and a former United Democratic Front (UDF) activist;

- (3) further recognises that Mr Peter served the ANC in various Eastern Cape structures, including as a member of the Provincial Executive Committee;
 - (4) acknowledges that he joined the Sixth Parliament as a member of the National Assembly and served in the Portfolio Committee on Tourism and the Standing Committee on Auditor-General;
 - (5) further acknowledges that he was one of the humblest of members of the Portfolio Committee on Tourism and was strongly passionate about diversity in the tourism sector;
 - (6) further recognises that he was a talented, diligent cadre and a remarkable strategist who proudly lived by the mantra: *“I will not sleep until the life of the poor has changed”*;
 - (7) recalls that he previously served as a ward councillor from 2000 to 2011, and from 2011 to 2015 as the Executive Mayor of Makana Municipality;
 - (8) further recalls that Mr Peter was a selfless and consummate servant who immersed himself well in the workings of the ANC Caucus and the National Assembly;
 - (9) remembers that when he expressed condolences to the family of the late Queen of AmaXhosa in the Eastern Cape, Mr Peter urged South Africans to adhere to the precautionary measures to limit the spread of Covid-19, and it is unfortunate that he would himself succumb to Covid-19; and
 - (10) extends its sincerest condolences to the family, loved ones, friends, comrades and colleagues of Mr Peter.
4. Draft resolution (Chief Whip of the Majority Party): That the House –
- (1) notes with deep sadness the sudden passing of African National Congress (ANC) MP, Advocate Hishaam Mohamed on 24 August 2020, after suffering a heart attack;
 - (2) acknowledges that he served as the provincial head of the Department of Justice and Constitutional Development in the Western Cape for over a decade;
 - (3) further acknowledges that he focused on providing access to justice and improved services by promoting community participation in the criminal justice system, particularly at courts serving in rural and informal settlements;
 - (4) recognises that he steered the establishment of the first Family Courts, Tax Court, Environmental Court, Mobile Courts and the development of Community Safety Fora;
 - (5) further recognises that he chaired several forums in the criminal and civil justice system at provincial level;

- (6) recalls that he joined the United Democratic Front (UDF) as an activist in 1985 and was detained for leading school marches and protesting against the arrests of UDF leaders;
- (7) further recalls that in 1987, he attended the University of the Western Cape to study law and continued his involvement in UDF activities both on and off campus;
- (8) understands that after qualifying with his degree, he demonstrated his dedication to human rights advocacy and justice through his participation in a number of human rights structures and professional bodies;
- (9) further understands that he served as a Public Prosecutor at the Mitchell's Plain Magistrates Office from 1993 to 1994, and was appointed as a Senior Family Advocate in the Office of the Family Advocate in Cape Town in 1995;
- (10) remembers that during this period, he was also elected as the ANC's first chairperson of its Southern Suburbs Region, where he remained actively involved until his death; and
- (11) conveys its heartfelt and deepest condolences to the family of Advocate Hishaam Mohamed, friends, colleagues and his comrades in the African National Congress, on the loss of an admirable cadre, a fighter for justice for all and a well-loved community activist.
