- (1) Whether all districts and metropolitan municipalities have developed their District Development Model One Plans as a critical joint strategic framework to align national, provincial and local government budgets and initiatives to prevent duplication and fast-track service delivery; if not, why not; if so, what are the relevant details;
- (2) whether the Government has developed any mechanisms and state capacity to assess progress of the One Plans to ensure coherence and synergy in the planning and service delivery in the local sphere of government; if not, why not; if so, (a) what measures are in place to ensure that the One Plans break the cycle of municipalities that spend their budgets on paying debts to creditors such as Eskom and Water Boards instead of delivering basic services to the communities? Whether, in light of his recent visit to Mitchells Plain to assess progress of Operation Prosper in waging coordinated efforts to combat gang violence, extortion and illegal mining across provinces, he has engaged the Acting Minister of Police and management of the SA Police Service to share the outcomes of the said visit and the need to sustain intensity of the fight against gang violence which remains the primary driver of serious crime in the province; if not, why not; if so, what are the relevant details? - (1) Whether, in terms of his mandates to implement rapid response interventions on service delivery and promote social cohesion initiatives, he has intervened to

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coordinate a unified response to escalating activities of the ‘March and March’ movement; if not, why not; if so, (a) what rapid response interventions have been deployed to address community safety concerns and hotspots that are affected by the said group’s ‘clean-up’ operations and (b) how is he coordinating with the Justice, Crime-Prevention and Security Cabinet Committee to ensure law enforcement retains sole authority over policing;

- (2) whether he has taken any actions to prevent public violence, xenophobic behaviour and parallel enforcement structures within local communities; if not, why not; if so, what actions?

- (2) whether the Task Team has initiated any drives to curb water loss, which amounts to approximately 50% of potable water that is wasted as a result of crumbling water infrastructure, leaving many communities without safe drinking water; if not, why not; if so, what are the relevant details?
