What coordinated measures is his department implementing to (a) support struggling municipalities, (b) improve maintenance and infrastructure investment and (c) prevent recurring electricity disruptions that undermine economic activity and public confidence, given the ongoing concerns regarding municipal electricity infrastructure deterioration, financial instability and service delivery failures? Body-worn police cameras**695. Mr M Billy (KwaZulu-Natal: DA) to ask the Acting Minister of Police:**

Whether the Government will commit to a time-bound national implementation plan for body-worn cameras for operational police officers, given the ongoing revelations regarding corruption, criminal infiltration, abuse of power and failures within sections of the SA Police Service, including concerns that are emerging from the Madlanga Commission process; if not, why not; if so, what are the relevant details? Safeguarding personal information**696. Ms L P Mhlongo (KwaZulu-Natal: MKP) to ask the Minister in the Presidency:**

(a) What measures are being coordinated across the relevant departments and entities to safeguard personal information of South Africans against cybersecurity threats as the Government advances the implementation of Digital Identity system and (b) how will the Government ensure transparency and accountability regarding security and integrity of the said system? Management of illegal immigration**697. Ms L P Mhlongo (KwaZulu-Natal: MKP) to ask the President of the Republic:**

(a) What coordinated interventions has the Government implemented to identify, process and deport undocumented persons, given his recent address to the nation regarding measures that are aimed at strengthening the management of illegal immigration on ongoing public concerns regarding undocumented foreign nationals and (b) how will the Government monitor and report progress and effectiveness of such interventions? Section 106 investigation**698. Ms M Makesini (Free State: EFF) to ask the Minister of Cooperative Governance and Traditional Affairs:**

Whether he will table the report arising from section 106 investigation into the affairs of the Nala Local Municipality; if not, why not; if so, (a) what are the reasons for the delays, given that more than 90 days have elapsed since the investigation was initiated and (b) what specific challenges and/or obstacles are preventing (i) finalisation and (ii) the tabling of the said report?

- (1) Whether he has been informed of the allegations of nepotism and possible irregular employment practices at the Lejweleputswa District Municipality, including the appointment of the current Executive Mayor's son and allegations that he has been receiving remuneration from both the Lejweleputswa District Municipality and Tokologo Local Municipality while on secondment; if not, what is the position in this regard; if so, what steps has he taken to investigate the said matter;
- (2) whether he has investigated the circumstances surrounding the liquidation of the Lejweleputswa Development Agency, including allegations that employees have not been paid for approximately ten months and concerns regarding compliance with legal and procedural requirements during such liquidation process; if not, why not; if so, (a) what were the findings and (b) what are the further relevant details;
- (3) whether his department has assessed qualifications, competency requirements and compliance of senior management appointments within the Lejweleputswa District Municipality with applicable legislation and regulations; if not, why not; if so, what are the relevant details;
- (4) whether his department has investigated allegations relating to the utilisation of municipal vehicles by the current Executive Mayor and the handling of previous vehicle accidents that are involving municipal vehicles which are allocated to the Speaker's Office; if not, why not; if so, (a) what corrective actions have been taken and (b) what are the further relevant details?

How many stock-theft cases have been withdrawn in the policing clusters of Taung, Vryburg and Dr Ruth Segomotsi Mompati District Municipality in the past three financial years, given the persistent escalation of stock theft in Taung–Vryburg corridor that is widely recognised as one of the most active rural crime hotspots in the North West?

*Repairing potholes/restoring road safety***703. Mr M K Montwedi (North West: EFF) to ask the Minister of Transport:**

What immediate short-term interventions her department has in place to (a) repair potholes and (b) restore road safety on national, provincial and municipal roads, including the deployment of rapid response maintenance teams, emergency patching programmes and storm-water clearing operations, given the extensive road damage and widespread potholes that have been caused by recent heavy rainfall across the North West, particularly affecting rural and farming communities?

*Land audit/immovable asset register***704. Mr V Gericke (Western Cape: EFF) to ask the Minister of Public Works and Infrastructure:**

- (1) Whether he has finalised its latest land audit and immovable asset register for the Western Cape in light of the critical shortage of well-located land for affordable and gap-market housing within the Western Cape municipalities which often forces marginalised residents into poorly integrated, low-lying and/or environmentally vulnerable areas; if not, what is the current status of the said audit; if so, on what date will the full audit report be available;
- (2) whether he has identified specific underutilised and/or vacant nationally owned land parcels within the Western Cape that are suitable for human settlement development; if so, (a) what are the relevant details of such land parcels and (b) what mechanisms are in place to expedite their transfer to provincial and municipal authorities for spatial redress?

- (a) What statutory frameworks, policies and vetting criteria are guiding the recruitment and appointment process of individuals who are serving on Correctional Supervision and Parole Boards (CSPBs), (b) how his department ensures that such processes guarantee objective, high-calibre decision-making that mitigates public and victim dissatisfaction regarding inmate releases, (c) what structural mechanisms exist for community participation and civil society input during the appointment phase of such board members and (d) what minimum academic qualifications, professional competencies and/or specialised training are mandatory for an individual to be eligible to serve on a CSPB?

- (2) what remedial actions will be instituted to unblock stalled projects, address municipal capacity failures and ensure that incompetent contractors are permanently blacklisted to prevent further wastage? CW853E

*Fiscal consolidation measures***709. Mr K Ceza (Mpumalanga: EFF) to ask the Minister of Public Service and Administration:**

Whether his department has conducted any assessments of the impact of the National Treasury's fiscal consolidation measures, expenditure ceilings and vacancy management policies on the State's ability to build a capable, professional and developmental public service; if not, why not; if so, what are the details of the findings, including the impact on the filling of funded positions in critical, technical and professional occupations such as engineers, artisans, town planners, environmental health practitioners, financial management professionals and financial management across national, provincial and local governments? *Eskom's direct tariff increasing***710. Ms M Kennedy (Limpopo: EFF) to ask the Minister of Electricity and Energy:**

- (a) What specific structural mechanisms are in his budget to protect vulnerable working-class households from being plunged into energy poverty with Eskom's direct tariff increasing by 8,76% and municipal customers facing similar hikes and (b) how will the rollout of the Distribution Agency Agreement assist municipalities to clear legacy debts to Eskom and improve local revenue collection? *Free Basic Electricity policy***711. Ms M Kennedy (Limpopo: EFF) to ask the Minister of Electricity and Energy:**

How his department plans to roll-out the revised Free Basic Electricity policy to reach the 3.5 million eligible indigent households that are currently missing out as a result of municipal shortcomings, broken meters and ghost accounts? CW856E

*Unresolved missing person's case***712. Mr M M Mampuru (Gauteng: EFF) to ask the Acting Minister of Police:**

With reference to a certain unresolved missing person's case (details furnished), (a) what specific operational reasons prevented the Midrand Police Station and Alexandra Family Violence, Child Protection and Sexual Offences Unit from executing basic time-sensitive investigative protocols, (b) how his department justifies failure of investigators to physically or forensically search the primary scene of disappearance and the father's apartment four months after the incident and (c) what measures is his department implementing to ensure that missing children cases involving indigent, structurally vulnerable families such as in the said incident where victim's unemployed mother and blind grandmother are based in the Eastern Cape and lack financial resources for legal representation are not deprioritised, neglected or relegated to 'low-priority' status by station-level detectives? *Electrification backlogs***713. Ms A Matshobeni (Eastern Cape: EFF) to ask the Minister of Electricity and Energy:**

With reference to the severe electrification backlogs in rural parts of the Eastern Cape, (a) what specific structural and funding causes are behind unequal distribution of grid infrastructure to remote communities such as Ngadla Village in Ward 22 of the Mbhashe Local Municipality, (b) what socio-economic impact assessments has his department conducted regarding the effects of the prolonged lack of connectivity on rural local economies, public safety and schooling in the affected area and (c) what immediate interventions through the Integrated National Electrification Programme or Eskom infill projects will be deployed to rectify such disparity? *Backlogs in basic electricity connections***714. Ms A Matshobeni (Eastern Cape: EFF) to ask the Minister of Cooperative Governance and Traditional Affairs:**

Noting that the Mbhashe Local Municipality's Integrated Development Plan continues to log massive backlogs in basic electricity connections, (a) what specific intergovernmental blockages exist between Eskom and the said municipality that prevent the completion of grid connections in Ward 22 in Ngadla Village and (b) how is his department assisting the said municipality to ensure that historically marginalised and un-electrified rural wards receive equitable allocation of alternative or grid-tied energy infrastructure? *Newly-constructed maternity ward at Dora Nginza Hospital***715. Ms A Matshobeni (Eastern Cape: EFF) to ask the Minister of Health:**

- (1) (a) What specific infrastructural, administrative or staffing reasons why the newly-constructed R2.9 million state-of-the-art maternity ward at the Dora Nginza Hospital in Gqeberha remains locked and completely unused months after its practical completion, (b) how he justifies allowing such a multi-million-rand facility to sit idle while the hospital's existing neonatal and maternal units face severe overcrowding,

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chronic resource shortages and ongoing public scrutiny over infant mortality rates and (c) what is the exact date on which the ward will be fully commissioned and opened to patients;

- (2) (a) what consequence management systems or disciplinary actions have been implemented against the Eastern Cape Department of Health officials and project managers that are responsible for such failure to operationalise completed state infrastructure and (b) what financial loss has the State incurred as a result of structural maintenance or security costs while the ward stood vacant? Combating corruption

716. Mr S A Zulu (Mpumalanga: MKP) to ask the Acting Minister of Police:

- (1) Whether his department has considered introducing a mandatory rotation policy that is requiring the SA Police Service members to be transferred after a maximum of two years at a station and investigate the feasibility of reviving secure police accommodation facilities to reduce undue local influence, given the persistent findings by the Independent Police Investigative Directorate, the Auditor-General and community reports that long-term station placements could contribute to corruption, collusion with criminal networks and weakened accountability; if not, why not; if so, (a) what measures are currently in place to combat station-level corruption syndicates and (b) what are the further relevant details;
- (2) whether his department has assessed the link between the long-term station placement and corruption; if not, what is the position in this regard; if so, what are the relevant details? CW861E

Spaza shop funding

- (1) (a) What is the total number of subsidised digital set-top boxes (STBs) that have been procured, distributed and successfully installed in each province since the inception of the South Africa's Broadcast Digital Migration (BDM) programme in each year as from inception of such a programme, given that 44 815 indigent households have been targeted for digital television migration with just over 30 000 installations are still outstanding with delays in the installation of such programme (details furnished), (b) what is the total expenditure incurred on the procurement, warehousing, distribution, installation and maintenance of STBs to date, (c) how much remains committed and/or budgeted for the completion of the said programme, (d) how many households remain outstanding in each province out of the targeted 447 815 households, (e) what are the primary reasons for the said outstanding installations, (f) what date his department intends to complete all the remaining installations and (g) how many indigent households that were originally identified as qualifying beneficiaries remain without access to digital television services;

- (2) whether any (a) internal investigations have been instituted into the circumstances surrounding the dissemination of information, including (i) persons and/or component tasked with conducting the investigation, (ii) terms of reference, (iii) the expected completion date and (iv) any preliminary findings made and (b) SAPS members have been suspended, issued with a warning and/or otherwise subjected to disciplinary steps as a result of the said incident; if not, why not; if so, what are the relevant details in each case;

- (3) whether any complaints, inspections, assessments and/or internal reports relating to leaking infrastructure, ablution facilities, plumbing and/or hot water shortages at the said base were recorded prior to the deployment commencing on 15 March 2026, including the dates on which such shortcomings were identified, if so, (a) by whom and (b) what remedial actions were taken prior to deployment;

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in this regard and (ii) what steps have been taken against him for allegedly fleeing the scene; if so, what are the relevant details in each case;

- (2) whether (a) any blood-alcohol and/or toxicology tests were conducted on the said member and (b) the SAPS has opened and/or intends to open any criminal charges against the said member for (i) reckless and negligent driving, (ii) abandoning the scene of an accident and/or (iii) defeating and/or obstructing the administration of justice; if not, why not; if so, what are the relevant details in each case;
